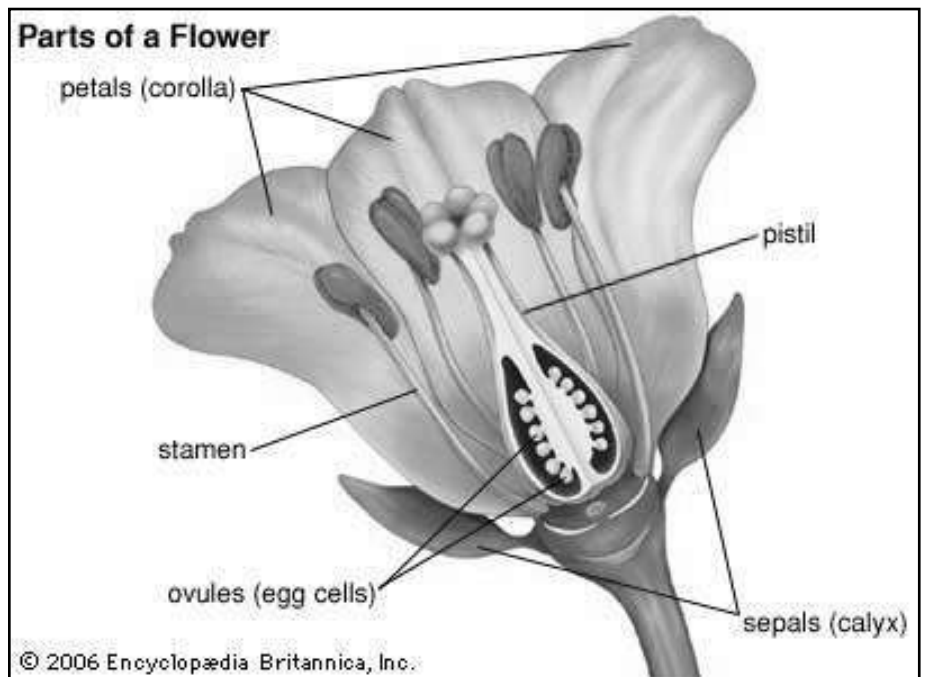


# Flower Sun-catcher

- Glue
- Flat dish (like a plate)
- Plastic cling wrap
- Flat flowers or leaves
- Scissors
- Paintbrush

1. Find some flowers or leaves to use for your sun catcher. Look for flat flowers like buttercups or daisies. If you don't know where to find flowers, you can use leaves. Try to find leaves with different textures.
2. Prepare your dish. Put a sheet of cling wrap on your dish. Then cover it with a layer of glue using your paintbrush.
3. Cut the stems off your flowers so only the petal part is left.
4. Arrange the flowers/leaves in the glue so they all face down.
5. Cover the flowers/leaves in another layer of glue.
6. Let the glue dry for two or three days. Flip the plastic wrap over after one day to help the glue dry on the other side.
7. Hold your sun catcher up to the light and let the flowers/leaves catch the sun! You can attach it to your window with a little bit of tape.

A sun-catcher is only beautiful when you can see the sun streaming through it. It’s just a piece of plastic when it’s in a dark closet!
