LEADER IN TRAINING PROGRAM

Tall Turf Ministries promotes positive youth development through various programs such as the Leader in Training (LIT) Program. The LIT Program specifically focuses on the experiential development of five core life skills in teens: planning, self-control, focus, awareness, and flexibility. Research in the field of youth development showcases practicing core life skills as essential for individual growth and development. The Tall Turf Ministries Leader in Training Program offers teens age 14-17 fun, faith, and fellowship in a safe and peaceful environment with opportunities for personal growth. The participants are granted leadership responsibility to engage in social justice issues that interest their cohorts of co-learners. Tall Turf ministries supported four LIT teen leaders-Jayda, Kamari, Samuel, and Symone- with mentorship and assistance provided by summer staff members Alexis Gray and Zoey Zupin.



LEADER IN TRAINING PROGRAM FEED BACK ON IMPACT OF PROGRAM

When teens were asked the impact or skills, they may have gained from this program we were told such statements as these below.

"I realized the value of communication skills, very much so. You get a very good idea of how to properly communicate, accommodate, and assist people of all ages. Along with that I think it overall made me a more patient or caring person, because you learn to be more considerate because you see the impact that you can have on a person by just being patient and caring despite how tired you might be."

"Perseverance, I think that is the main one because getting through a family camp takes a lot of work and you will be exhausted by the end of it. I have also learned more about how to keep a group in control and become more confident in controlling a group of people I'm responsible for."

"I think I learned a lot about listening skills and also directing skills. Along with that having the confidence to get people's attention. With young children they can be rowdy and are more difficult to get their attention. I was surprised that I was able to stay patient, get their attention, and then progress without spending too much time and straying away from the goal."
