The CEO's Corner

November 2, 2016, marked my one year anniversary with Tall Turf Ministries. While the work we are called to do at Tall Turf is not easy, God is a lways faithful. When I was hired, the Board of Directors tasked me to address several significant challenges, declining financial support and implementing strategic planning, among other things. After a year of investing significant time addressing these challenges, I am grateful to report the following:

- Board Giving is up 125%
- Corporate giving is up 63%
- Summer camp fees are up 34%
- Foundations budgeted \$150,000 for this year has been surpassed
- Tall Turf took 1st place at the presentation competition for the Knights of the Round Table International Convention
- 1st quarter revenue up 18%, expenses down 16%
- 2nd quarter revenue up 26%, expenses down 9%
- 3rd quarter revenue up 18%, expenses down 65%

What is most important, however, is that we served over 600 youth and families this summer. Through God's grace and mercy we continue to be blessed. We look forward to another year of camp, new colla borations, and changes to further our call. This would not be possible without you. Thank you all for the opportunity to serve Tall Turf Ministries!

2016 Building Bridges Banquet: Be the Hero



October 27, 2016, Tall Turf held their annual Building Bridges banquet. It was an incredible evening celebrating all that God is doing through Tall Turf. The evening began with Leader In Training (LIT), Justin Aurich, sharing a personal testimony. Justin shared the following, "While Tall Turf has taught me be to a good leader, even more importantly they have taught me to be a Christian leader.... One of the biggest ways I have seen God work through Tall Turf is in the ministry of reconciliation. Throughout the past 9 years I have been involved in Tall Turf I have built strong friendships with people from many different cultures and backgrounds. By doing this Tall Turf has broadened my very small perspective of the world and has also taught me more about who God is." Summer staff member, Tina Roede, also reflected on the impact Tall Turf has had in her life. As a former camper and

She challenged supporters to "Be the Hero" for children who Tall Turf impacts by investing their talents, prayers, and finances. Tall Turf was also honored to present two special awards. LITs, Noemy Parra-Cano and Arion Parks, were presented with the inaugural Emerging Leader Award, which seeks to recognize young leaders who have exemplified a desire to grow in their faith, positive leadership among peers and youth, a willingness to serve others and a commitment to the ministry of reconciliation. The evening concluded with past staff sharing a camp chant through the words of theme verse Joshua 1:9, "Be strong and courageous...for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."

Did you know . . .

- Tall Turf hosted 3 Youth Camp sessions, 1 High School Adventure Camp, and 4 Family Camp weekends.
- Tall Turf served over 600 youth and families this summer!
- 57% of our campers were African -American, 16% Caucasian, 14% Hispanic, 2% Asian and 11% identified as multi-racial or other.
- Campers this summer came from the Grand Rapids area, Holland, Newaygo, White Cloud, Virginia, Detroit, MI and Chicago, IL.
- As of 2011, only 4% of the 12,000 camps in the United States had at least 50% minority counselors. Tall Turf has had at least 60% qualified staff of color for the last 10 years. In fact, this past summer 63% of our summer staff members were people of color.
- 60% of our summer staff members were returning staff mem-
- 56% of our summer Leaders In Training were previously summer campers and/or junior Leaders in Training.
- 79% of our campers befriended someone from a background that is different from their own.
- 83% of our campers reported that they felt better about themselves as a result of their time at
- More than 60 campers made the decision to trust Jesus as the ir Savior for the first time while at camp!!!





Summer LITs: Leading through Service

time stretching themselves as leaders through serving in a variety of ways at camp. Whether it was catching frogs with campers, washing



added a Latino Family Camp weekend. However, in pursuit of our mission of reconciliation, we decided

to make an important shift by bringing families together from all

backgrounds to what is now known as Tall Turf Family Camp Weekends. Families of all backgrounds attended this summer including: African-American, Caucasian, Hispanic, single parent, two-parent, grandmothers, grandfathers, aunts, uncles, and cousins. Each weekend was an amazing time of seeing families strengthened

through spending time together in activities, meals, and worship. In total, we were blessed to be able to host four separate Family Camp Weekends, including a special 4th of July session. One family shared, that their favorite part about the

> weekend was "meeting more 'family' members." This work would not have been possible without our amazing partners. This

summer we were thankful to welcome new partners, Iglesia Vida Plena and Madison Church Ford Campus. We are grateful for their commitment to work together in strengthening families.
